Even in its format is Maps4Society innovative – it has been officially shaped now as a Cooperation Programme, a new funding instrument by. This has turned it into a tailormade programme that requires a bit more time to organize by STW. By end of October, we expect to open the call. Consequently, the matchmaking event in The Hague has been postponed to the afternoon of November 8th. The first call will allow to submit Small Innovative Projects (KIPs, max 50 K Euro) as a pre-proposal for larger research projects.

Up to 41 Expressions of Interest (EoIs) have so far been submitted to Maps4Society! An EoI is a short, written indication of an idea for the call. A price will be awarded to the best idea, and in the next issue, early November, we will announce the three best ideas. The EoIs can be found on our Wiki, via the M4S website. Certainly worth some checking, to pick up ideas, find potential partners, and effecticely spend your networking time at the matchmaking event.
